Dear Senator Hagan,

The City of Charlotte is greatly concerned about the potential rescission of federal highway funds unless Congress acts to delay or void the rescission before the October 1 deadline.

The estimated \$250 million loss to North Carolina is projected to include at least \$3.3 million in direct funding to the City of Charlotte through special planning and air quality grants.

We continue to promote federal stimulus funding for infrastructure improvements and accompanying construction jobs. Therefore, it is difficult to understand how significant transportation building funds are subject to disappear because of a technical rescission requirement in the existing transportation bill which expires September 30.
