I write to call your attention to an issue of immediate and grave concern to the North Carolina Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations. This issue is the pending rescission of federal highway funds, due to take effect on September 29th unless Congress acts now to fix this problem.

If no action is taken the rescission will lead to a major reduction in otherwise available federal highway funds across the nation. \$8.7 billion would be cut nationally. In North Carolina \$250 million dollars would be cut. This will have very negative impact on cities, Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) and the State DOT in North Carolina and across the nation.

In North Carolina, a \$250 million dollar federal-aid cut exceeds 27% of a typical years' federal highway funding allocation. That would directly undermine the hard work State, Local, and MPO officials have put into the timely implementation of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funded projects. Given the weakened state of the economy and the proven benefits of targeted infrastructure investment, this would be a very bad time for a rescission.
