







2010-17 growth rate by population size in 2017








Share of population vs. share of growth by population in 2017










Growth by components of change, total, 2010-17




Cities 25K+ generally younger than state

Median age, 2016




College towns, military bases very young

Median age, 2016




Charlotte suburbs relatively older

Median age, 2016 5-Year ACS




Immigrant impact greatest in major metros

Share of population foreign-born (vs. 7.7% statewide), 2016




Most immigrants from Latin America, Asia

Share of population by region of origin, 2016











NC firm growth (Q4), 2007-2017








