1 Introduction

This report summarizes the Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group's Steering Committee kickoff meeting held on June 22, 2009 in Raleigh at the North Carolina Department of Transportation building.

2 **Opening Comments**

NCDOT Chief Operation Officer (COO) Jim Trogdon opened the meeting explaining why the NCDOT has convened the Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group and what role the Steering Committee will have in this work. He emphasized NCDOT's commitment to collaborating with first ever Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group on process design.

COO Trogdon highlighted several key points for the Advisory Group:

- The Perdue Administration, NCDOT Secretary Gene Conti, and the entire management team at NCDOT are committed to working collaboratively with local governments.
- Several studies and commissions have cited the need to improve policy and working relations between NCDOT and local governments. Recently, 21st Century Transportation Committee recommended a cooperative and collaborative working relationship between NCDOT and local governments. The Legislatively appointed Committee noted that NCDOT should assist local governments in coordinating land-use and transportation planning and that NCDOT should explore opportunities for improved delivery and efficiency of existing transportation services by working with the state local government associations (NCLM, NCACC, etc).
- Challenging issues including funding and financing, relates to roles and responsibilities for transportation. NCDOT sees this Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group as a potential model for greater future collaboration on such complex issues.
- The Steering Committee for the Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group must discuss how to develop shared ownership between the Policy Advisory Group and NCDOT. All Steering Committee members should help design this effort and decide on a work and policy program that they will participate in going forward; it should not be "driven" by DOT, but designed jointly to meet shared goals.
- The Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group has an opportunity to help reshape the working relationship between NCDOT and local government partners in the context of a broader NCDOT transformation process



3 Success Factors

During a facilitated discussion, participants shared their insights about previous policy development efforts that were both successful and unsuccessful. Each participant was asked to think about their previous experiences developing public policy and describe key ingredients for success- as well as things to avoid. Fountainworks posed the question, 'How can this group be successful?'

- Work for early successes/Low hanging fruit
- Good communications builds positive energy
- Seeing issues from all perspectives
- Avoid mid-stream "rogue advocacy"
- Shared ownership of process and products
- Need to "see the end of the tunnel"

- Definitive outcomes
- Expert assistance in groups
- Avoid over-promising
- Commit to ground rules
- Focused and prioritized
- Key stakeholders at the table



Defining Goals and Short Term Needs:

Participants were asked to focus on Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group goals as well as what the Steering Committee needs in order to move forward.

Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group Goals and Priorities:



Explain policy process – "One pager" from <u>each</u> Partner Need strong signal that relations are shifting Partners – not adversaries

Steering Comm Communications plan – for Partners

Clear understanding of transportation trends

Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group Goal:

Design & manage a collaborative process identifying policies that result in NCDOT and local governments working together more effectively. NCDOT and local governments will establish and direct expert workgroups to explore opportunities for improved policies and practices rather than do all the work themselves.

Top Priority:

Demonstrate consistent and transparent communication that demonstrates the advisory group is working to overcome former adversarial tone.



First Major Project for Steering Committee:

Establish a workgroup that will make notable progress reducing disconnect between land use and transportation.

What is Needed Now to Move Forward:

The Steering Committee members discussed specific actions and information needed in the shortterm to help the Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group move forward:

- Each participant wants to better understand the internal policy making process of the others including the policy decision process for the NC Board of Transportation and the advocacy and policy processes and timelines for the NC League of Municipalities. Each committee member agrees to prepare a one-page summary of their policy process to share at the July 20th Steering Committee meeting.
- 2) The Committee agreed on a need for a common understanding of the current trends in transportation and current challenges facing NC including the current state of land use and transportation planning integration. This needs to be communicated consistently.
- 3) The Steering Committee members agree it is essential to establish a clear understanding by all parties that this effort is a shift from the past, commitment to a sincere collaborative working relationship, and that this Steering Committee will be taken seriously and will focus on "making things different."
- 4) Steering Committee needs a communication plan to communicate to their constituent members a consistent and commonly understood message for the motivations, objectives and work plan of the Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Group.

Values Underlying Ground Rules:


Valid Information Free and Informed Choice Internal Commitment

Ground Rules:

Test Assumptions and Inferences Share All Relevant Information Focus on Interests, not Positions Be Specific- Use Examples Agree on What Important Words Mean Explain the Reasons Behind One's Statements, Questions, and Actions Disagree Openly with Any Member of the Group Make Statements, then Invite Questions and Comments Jointly Design Ways to Test Disagreements and Solutions Discuss Undiscussable Issues Keep the Discussion Focused Do Not Take Cheap Shots or Otherwise Distract the Group All members are Expected to Participate in All Phases of the Process Exchange Relevant Information with Nongroup Members Make Decisions by Consensus Do Self-Critique


At the conclusion of the kickoff meeting the participants had developed the following preliminary gameplan for the Steering Committee of the Intergovernmental Advisory Group.


